Fashion Forward is a unique design challenge for Clark County high school students, patterned after the popular TV show, Project Runway. It aims to enhance the education of local design and fashion students and gives aspiring designers the opportunity to showcase their designs in a public setting.

Proceeds from this signature event supports the Junior League of Las Vegas, its mission, and advance our area of focus which aims to make an impact on youth ages 12 and over in the areas of education, and overall health and wellness within our community.

This year, students from 7 schools started Round 1 of the competition by creating an up-cycled garment from materials and funds generously donated by Goodwill of Southern Nevada.

Participating schools includes: Centennial High School, Del Sol Academy of the Performing Arts, Green Valley High School, Las Vegas Academy of the Arts, Las Vegas High School, Shadow Ridge High School and West Preparatory Academy.

Today, finalists from Round 2 will present their original design during the finale show, The Gift of Fashion. Their inspired wears were created using blue fabric donated by Allegiant Airlines, trim from Star Costume and Theatrical Supply, and \$30 to use towards materials donated by the Junior League of Las Vegas. As an experienced seamstress, she created her family-run business, Britta Leigh Designs, taking great pride in the relationships she builds with her customers and in the community. She and her team are fastidious about quality construction and strive to create long lasting, stylish, and sophisticated creations.

"My tools are industrial sewing machines that allow me to create garments using everything from lightweight chiffon to handbags with leather. About twenty years ago, I began creating high quality handbags that mixed my love of fashion with my love of sewing as a creative outlet to offset a high stress finance career. Britta joined the Junior League of Las Vegas in 2002 and held numerous chair and board positions including President in 2012/2013. A native Las Vegan and life-long sewer, Britta helped start the Fashion Forward project as the Provisional Training project in 2007-2008.



Jennifer Inaba: Sustainable Fashion Advocate Las Vegas Fashion Council Board of Directors

Jennifer is an award-winning communications professional and a sustainable fashion advocate who has worked in the conservation and advocacy space for nearly 20 years. She has a driven focus on sustainability and environmental justice to protect the future of the planet and people – with a specific interest in the fashion industry.

Jennifer provides pro bono advocacy and policy support for Fashion Revolution USA, the world's largest fashion activism movement to increase awareness and transparency in the industry, and is an ambassador for Remake, a global advocacy organization fighting for fair pay and climate justice in the clothing industry. She is currently a PhD candidate studying how to improve fashion industry transparency and consumer education. Jennifer joined the Las Vegas Fashion Council Board of Directors in 2023 to bring an environmental and social sustainability lens to their efforts to diversify and expand the Las Vegas economy through the fashion industry.

Larissa has cultivated her passion for fashion since she was a child. She watched her mother's own clothing business grow from a home office to the first retail location. Larissa is a 4th generation seamstress and fashion designer who studied at Monterrey Center for Higher Learning of Design. At age 21, she opened her first store and original label Larissa Classic, selling high end corporate uniforms to the business chic women.

A decade later, Larissa followed her passion and moved to Las Vegas with her family. Starting over with two children isn't easy, but a fashionista never stops working. From a home studio to her own store in less than 8 years, Larissa built her client base from the ground up while working as the head of production for The Dealer's Room, eventually rebranding her style as LarissaCoutureLV in 2015.

Today her work ranges from hospitality uniforms to modeling agencies, from dance wear to formal wear, and from toddlers to golden years. As CEO and lead designer of her own label, Larissa looks forward to many more years of professional growth and community engagement.

Teachers (continued)




