

Fashion Forward is a unique design challenge for Clark County high school students, patterned after the popular TV show, *Project Runway.* Fashion Forward aims to enhance the education of local design and fashion students and gives aspiring designers the opportunity to showcase their designs in a public setting. Fashion Forward is celebrating its 11th year and is thrilled to be back after a 2-year pandemic hiatus. Fashion Forward is a signature JLLV event which has traditionally hosted an exciting finale in the Spring of each year. Proceeds from Fashion Forward support the Junior League of Las Vegas, its mission and advance our area of focus which aims to make an impact on youth ages 12 and over in the areas of education and overall health and wellness within our community.















This Year's Event

The theme for 2021-2022 is **Reuse Reimagine Refashion: Creating Fashion Sustainability**. 373 students from 7 schools started Round 1 of the competition this past fall. Las Vegas Academy, West Preparatory Academy, Del Sol Academy, Las Vegas, Green Valley, Shadow Ridge, and Centennial are the participating high schools.

There are 2 categories for the competition. The Designer students sewed a pencil pouch project, and the Couture students created an up-cycle garment to determine who were going to advance to Round 2 of Fashion Forward. Goodwill Industries generously donated \$20 gift cards for each student in Round 1.

46 finalists tasked with sewing an original design have advanced to Round 2. Over 200 yards of fabric was kindly provided by Allegiant Airlines for this year's finale. Designer students also got \$40 and Couture students got \$50 VISA gift cards donated by the JLLV. These were the materials used to bring to life an ensemble from student sketches which encapsulated "Creating Fashion Sustainability". We are so proud to showcase the hard work that the students have created with the guidance of their fantastic teachers, especially in view of the pandemic.


